

Fifth Sunday of Lent ***March 22, 2015***

La Historia y Usted: Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma
Dónde vives? Pasen y vean. Con esa invitación,
Jesús atrae a los primeros discípulos a sí mismo.
Han oído hablar de él, pero eso no es suficiente.
Quiéren conocerlo.

Es interesante que en los tres primeros evangelios --
- llamó los sinópticos porque cuentan la historia con
el mismo ojo-Jesús llama a sus discípulos lejos de
sus barcos de pesca y en la vida pública con él. Pero
en el evangelio de Juan, los primeros discípulos lo
buscan en primer lugar. Ellos se acercan a él, y él
los invita a venir y ver.

¡Qué gran mensaje de Cuaresma para nosotros. La
vida espiritual a veces se ilumina con Dios
"encuentros" -tiempos cuando sentimos el Espíritu
Santo vive en nosotros, y nosotros con alegría
responder. Esta fue la experiencia de Pedro,
Santiago y Juan, cuando Jesús los encontró y los
llamó.

Pero la mayor parte de nuestras vidas, que
espirituales, es decir, nuestras vidas reales, se gasta
la búsqueda activa de Cristo, posicionándonos para
que lo encontremos en la que vive.

Así que esa es nuestra gran, búsqueda que
conmueve el alma. ¿Tiene un lugar de encuentro
con él, donde se encuentra el Espíritu Santo cada
vez que vaya allí? Algunos amigos a encontrar a
Cristo cada vez que sirven una comida a las
personas sin hogar. Otros lo buscan donde vive por
vivir y trabajar en los lugares más difíciles en el
mundo en desarrollo.

Para mí, cualquier escuela donde los niños están a
salvo y feliz es donde Cristo parece habitar en
deliciosa abundancia. Pero sé que tengo que ir a
verlo en las escuelas donde los niños tienen hambre,
y no es seguro. Como dijo la Madre Teresa, "No es
Cristo en su disfraz más angustioso."

The Story and You: Fifth Sunday in Lent
Where do you live? Come and see. With that
invitation, Jesus draws the first disciples to himself.
They have heard of him, but that's not enough.
They want to *know him*.

It's interesting that in the earliest three gospels---
called the *Synoptics* because they tell the story with

the *same eye*—Jesus calls the disciples away from
their fishing boats and into public life with him. But
in John's gospel the first disciples *seek him first*.
They approach *him*, and he invites them to *come
and see*.

What a great Lenten message for us. The spiritual
life is sometimes illuminated with "God
encounters"—moments when we feel the Holy
Spirit alive in us, and we joyfully respond. This was
the experience of Peter, James and John when Jesus
found them and called them.

But most of our spiritual lives—which is to say, our
real lives—is spent actively seeking Christ,
positioning ourselves so that we may encounter him
where he lives.

So that's our great, soul-stirring quest. Do you have
a place of encounter with him, where you find the
Holy Spirit every time you go there? Some friends
find Christ every time they serve a meal to those
who are homeless. Others seek him *where he lives*
by living and working in the most challenging
places in the developing world.

For me, any school where children are safe and
happy is where Christ seems to dwell in delightful
abundance. But I know that I must *come and see*
him in the schools where children are hungry, and
not safe. As Mother Teresa said, "There is Christ in
his most distressing disguise."

Where do you go to find Christ where he lives?
