Dear Parish:  
We have a supply of reloadable King Soopers gift cards, and would like to start giving them out this week-end. We will give out the cards to anyone that wants to help support A & R. The cards already have \$2.50 on them, and all you have to do is "load" the card at the check-out **BEFORE** you have the clerk start ringing up your order. The cards are good for all groceries, gas and stamps. You cannot purchase another gift card (Target or Olive Garden, etc) with the King's Gift Card. Gift cards can be reloaded for up to \$500.00 at a time. The balance on the card is printed at the bottom of your receipt after checkout. Cards with a zero balance for 90 days are inactivated, and a new card would have to be given. When, as a group, we reach \$5,000.00 loaded on the cards, we will be sent a \$250.00 check, and the counting starts again. If we don't reach the \$5,000.00 in one period, it rolls over to the next month. If you have any questions, or want us to start at another time, please let me know as soon as possible so I can let those members know what week we will begin.
