Y apuesto que usted también ha sido esa mujer con el derrame, agotada por una enfermedad crónica, desgastada de las interminables visitas a los médicos, todavía con dolor, todavía siendo una carga para sus seres queridos. Tal vez sea ese fastidiosos dolor de espalda, o artritis, o esa vieja lastimadura que se hizo jugando fútbol que hace que sus mañanas sean tan dolorosas. Usted sabe lo que es anhelar la sanación. ¿Y a que no también ha sido el niño que sufre? ¿No hubo alguna vez cuando usted se sentía miserable con alguna enfermedad y sus padres dejaron todo para llevarlo al doctor? Nunca olvidaré ese dolor de oídos que me comenzó cuando estaba practicando las divisiones largas en el cuarto grado de primaria. (Ambos recuerdos todavía me dan dolor de estomago.) Zas, entro mi mamá en el salón. Zas, llegamos al doctor y recibí esa bendita inyección, y ese bendito alivio. Creo que Jesús, el Sanador, ha cambiado sus planes hoy, y viene en camino hacia usted. Salga a recibirlo. *¿De que manera se presta para ser sanado?*

Ah. Here it is again. Every time it shocks me to the core. St. Mark gives us a fascinating account, loaded with hidden meanings, of the healing of two females within a few moments of each other.

Find yourself somewhere in this story. I believe that is exactly what Mark intended.

Jesus meant to stay by the sea. But the synagogue official, terrified of his daughter's sudden illness, begged him to change his plans. You've been there too, haven't you? You've allowed your time and your plans to be changed on a dime when someone has needed you. And perhaps you've also been the frantic relative, begging Jesus to heal your loved one. There is no terror like that of a parent whose child is desperately ill. Have you been there?

And I'll bet you've also been that hemorrhaging woman, exhausted from chronic illness, worn out from endless doctor's visits, still in pain, still a burden to your loved ones. Maybe it's that nagging back pain, or arthritis, or the old football injury that makes your mornings so painful. You know what it's like to long for healing. And haven't you also been the suffering child? Was there a time when you were miserable with illness, and your parents dropped everything to get you to the doctor? I will never forget the earache that came on during fourth-grade long division. (Both memories can still give me a stomachache.) Whoosh came my mom into class. Whoosh came the doctor, and the blessed shot, and blessed relief.

I think that Jesus, the Healer, has changed his plans today, and is heading your way. Go out to meet him. *How do you position yourself in order to be healed?*
