The Story and You: Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

When I read about the lavish care the “sinful woman” gives to Jesus I feel a lingering sense of anger. The Pharisees are shocked, of course, and I think we would be too. They are stunned that this “prophet” doesn’t realize that he is letting a woman of the streets touch him. We would be stunned at anyone in our world today who is capable of feeling great sorrow for sin. I’m thinking, for example, of Dylann Roof. Just hours after he murdered nine people in prayer at Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church one year ago, the survivors and the loved ones of the murdered gathered to announce that they had forgiven him. They forgave because they chose long ago to immerse their brains and hearts in Jesus and the scriptures. Hence, they knew that forgiveness was the only balm that could heal them.

Dylann appears to be unfazed by that astonishing love. At age 21, his brain was, of course, still not fully formed. He was, like so many of his mass-murderer cohort, “shy.” And he had easy access to vicious, ugly, white supremacist websites which no doubt filled in the gaps left by a culture that doesn’t require us to honestly and painfully reflect on our sins, in what we have done and what we have failed to do.

The scriptures show us how the rightly formed human heart responds to forgiveness. Think of the prodigal son, or the “sinful woman,” or St. Peter. Even the Roman centurion, filled with remorse after the crucifixion, cried, “Truly this was the Son of God” (Mk. 15:39).

Where are the weeping gun dealers? Where are the horrified website managers? Where, for that matter, are we?

How are you showing your deep gratitude to those who have forgiven you?

La Historia y Usted: Onceavo Domingo de Tiempo Ordinario

Cuando leo acerca del espléndido cuidado que la “mujer pecadora” tuvo con Jesús, experimento una

sensación de prolongado enojo. Los fariseos están sorprendidos, por supuesto, y creo que también yo lo estaría. Están estupefactos de que este “profeta” no se de cuenta de que está permitiendo que una mujer de la calle lo toque. Nosotros estaríamos sorprendidos en nuestro mundo de hoy de cualquier persona que sea capaz de sentir gran pesar por el pecado.

Estoy pensando, por ejemplo, en Dylann Roof. A solo horas después de haber asesinado a nueve personas en un grupo de oración en la Iglesia Metodista Episcopal Africana Emanuel hace un año, los sobrevivientes y los seres queridos de los asesinados se reunieron para anunciar que lo habían perdonado. Lo perdonaron porque ya habían elegido desde mucho tiempo atrás sumergir sus cerebros y corazones en Jesús y las escrituras. Así que, ellos sabían que el perdón sería el único bálsamo que los podría curar.

Dylann parecía despreocupado por ese amor extraordinario. A la edad de 21 años, su cerebro no estaba, por supuesto, totalmente formado. Él era, como muchos de sus compañeros asesinos en masa, “tímido.” Y tenía acceso fácil a despiadados y horrendos sitios de internet racistas extremos, los cuales sin duda rellenan los huecos que deja una cultura que no requiere que honesta y dolorosamente reflexionemos acerca de nuestros pecados, en lo que hemos hecho y hemos omitido hacer. Esta escritura nos muestra como un corazón humado correctamente formado debe responder al perdón. Piensa en el hijo prodigo, o en la “mujer pecadora,” o en San Pedro. Hasta el centurión Romano, lleno de remordimiento después de la crucifixión, gritó, “Ciertamente este era el Hijo de Dios” (Marcos 15:39).

¿Dónde están los traficantes de armas que lloran?
¿Dónde están los horrorizados supervisores de sitios de internet? ¿Dónde estamos, a propósito, nosotros mismos?

¿Cómo estás mostrando tu profunda gratitud a aquellos que te han perdonado?

Don't forget to register your child for Faith Formation classes this fall! We are currently accepting registrations for all students in grades K-8. The Early Registration deadline is June 15, 2016. There's only one more week to take advantage of the \$10 per student discount, so don't wait! Registration is \$40 per student for Sunday classes, and \$35 additional for sacramental preparation, either Confirmation or First Eucharist. After June 15 the registration fee goes up to \$50 per student. Make checks payable to St Rose of Lima, or you may pay online by going to the website at www.srl-denver.org and clicking on the DONATE button. If your child will be preparing for sacraments this year, please be sure to provide a copy of his/her baptismal certificate. No student will be able to begin preparation until we receive their baptism record! **Registration deadline** for classes is September 4, 2016.
