Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Pharisee and the tax collector have something sacred to teach us. We must hold it close. To realize that we might actually be the Pharisees, the ones who think (secretly, of course) that we are more deserving of God's mercy than anyone else, is a grace in itself. The surest and quickest passage to God's mercy is to be profoundly aware of our need of it. I'll bet that most readers immediately identify with the humble "sinner," never realizing that the Pharisee is much closer to their true identity.

Try to remember a time when you were humbled by sin. Maybe one of the deadly sins has you in its vise, and a lifetime of wrath, for example, finds you banging on the hood of somebody's stalled car at rush hour. Or maybe, like me, you are intentionally blind to the deadly sin of greed, so that a lifetime of using far more resources than the rest of the world gets to have has made you dependent and weak. It's a precious gift to be humbled, to bow before God and say, "Lord, I thank you that I've finally been found out. I thank you that the world now knows what you've known all along. I want to change more than I want to keep up the charade of being less sinful than I am. I humbly realize that I'm not fooling anybody, especially not you. *Be merciful to me, a sinner.*" Recognizing and naming our sinfulness doesn't feel good, but it changes us. It nudges us a bit closer to heaven, where sinners are welcomed home every day.

El fariseo y el recaudador de impuestos tienen algo sagrado que enseñarnos. Debemos atesorarlo. El darnos cuenta de que podríamos ser los fariseos, aquellos que piensan (secretamente, por supuesto) que somos más merecedores que los demás de la

misericordia de Dios, es una gracia por sí sola. El más seguro y rápido camino a la misericordia de Dios es el estar profundamente conscientes de que la necesitamos. Apuesto a que la mayoría de los lectores inmediatamente se identifican con el humilde "pecador," sin jamás darse cuenta de que el fariseo es más parecido a su verdadera identidad. Intenta recordar un tiempo cuando el pecado te hizo humilde. Tal vez uno de los pecados mortales te tiene atrapado, y toda una vida de rabia, por ejemplo, te lleva a golpear el cofre del auto descompuesto de otra persona durante la hora del tráfico. O tal vez, como yo, te encuentras intencionalmente ciego al pecado mortal de la avaricia, y después de haber utilizado mucho más de los recursos que le pertenecen al resto del mundo te hayas vuelto dependiente y débil.

Es un regalo precioso el hacernos humildes, el bajar la cabeza ante Dios y decirle, "Señor, te doy gracias porque ya me pusiste al descubierto. Te doy gracias porque ahora el mundo sabe lo que tú siempre has sabido. Quiero cambiar en lugar de mantener la careta de ser menos pecador de lo que realmente soy. Humildemente me doy cuenta de que no estoy engañando a nadie, especialmente a ti. *Ten misericordia de mí, un pecador.*" El reconocer y nombrar lo pecadores que somos no nos hace sentir bien, pero nos cambia. Nos empuja más cerca al cielo, donde los pecadores son bienvenidos todos los días.
